## Boil water advisory for Saint-Bruno-de-Montarville

**Saint-Bruno-de-Montarville, April 17, 2024** — The City of Longueuil issues a boil water advisory for Saint-Bruno-de-Montarville and the Saint-Hubert boroughs. This measure is necessary following a drop in water pressure due to work on the drinking water network.

We recommend boiling the water for at least one minute before consumption, until further notice and for a minimum of 24 hours.

### What you must do

You must use tap water that has previously been boiled to a rolling boil for one minute, or bottled water, for all of the following uses until an advisory to the contrary is issued:

- To drink and prepare beverages;
- To prepare baby bottles and baby food;
- To wash and prepare raw food (fruits, vegetables, etc.);
- To prepare foods that do not require extended cooking time (canned soups, desserts, etc.);
- To make ice cubes;
- To brush your teeth and rinse your mouth;
- To provide drinking water to pets.

### You can use tap water directly to:

- Prepare foods and dishes that require prolonged boiling for cooking;
- Wash dishes in hot water with detergent, making sure to dry them well;
- Run the dishwasher on the hottest cycle;
- Wash clothes and take a shower or bath. For young children, make sure they do not swallow any water while bathing or use a washcloth to wash them.
- If your home is equipped with a water treatment device, you must follow the above steps unless it is a household water purifier designed to disinfect the water. Devices such as water softeners are generally ineffective at removing microorganisms

### Serviced schools, enterprises, businesses and institutions

- Turn off all water fountains and post notices near other taps where water is still available.
